



Mullin Automotive Museum New Exhibit Features French Coachbuilders

Ostentatiously called “L’époque des Carrossiers: The Art and Times of the French Coachbuilders,” the latest Mullin exhibit showcases spectacular examples of some of the most acclaimed cars in the world, including the a Bugatti Type 57SC Atlantic, a 1939 Delahaye Type 165 Cabriolet and a 1937 Talbot-Lago T150-C SS.

In addition to these magnificent vehicles, also on display are concours winning vehicles such as a 1938 Dubonnet Hispano-Suiza H6B and the revolutionary 1934 Voisin Type C27 Aérospport Coupe.

The Museum collection houses over 140 objects, not only rare concours winning cars but also historic race winners, art and furniture,

Anyone who appreciates fine cars will enjoy this; Delahayes, Delages, Bugattis are not often seen at local car shows.

The Mullin Automotive Museum is located at 1421 Emerson Avenue, Oxnard, CA 93033, in the building formerly occupied by the Otis Chandler Vintage Museum of Transportation and Wildlife. The museum is typically open to the public on the second and fourth Saturdays of every month from 10 AM to 3 PM. Tickets must be purchased in advance at www.MullinAutomotiveMuseum.com.
